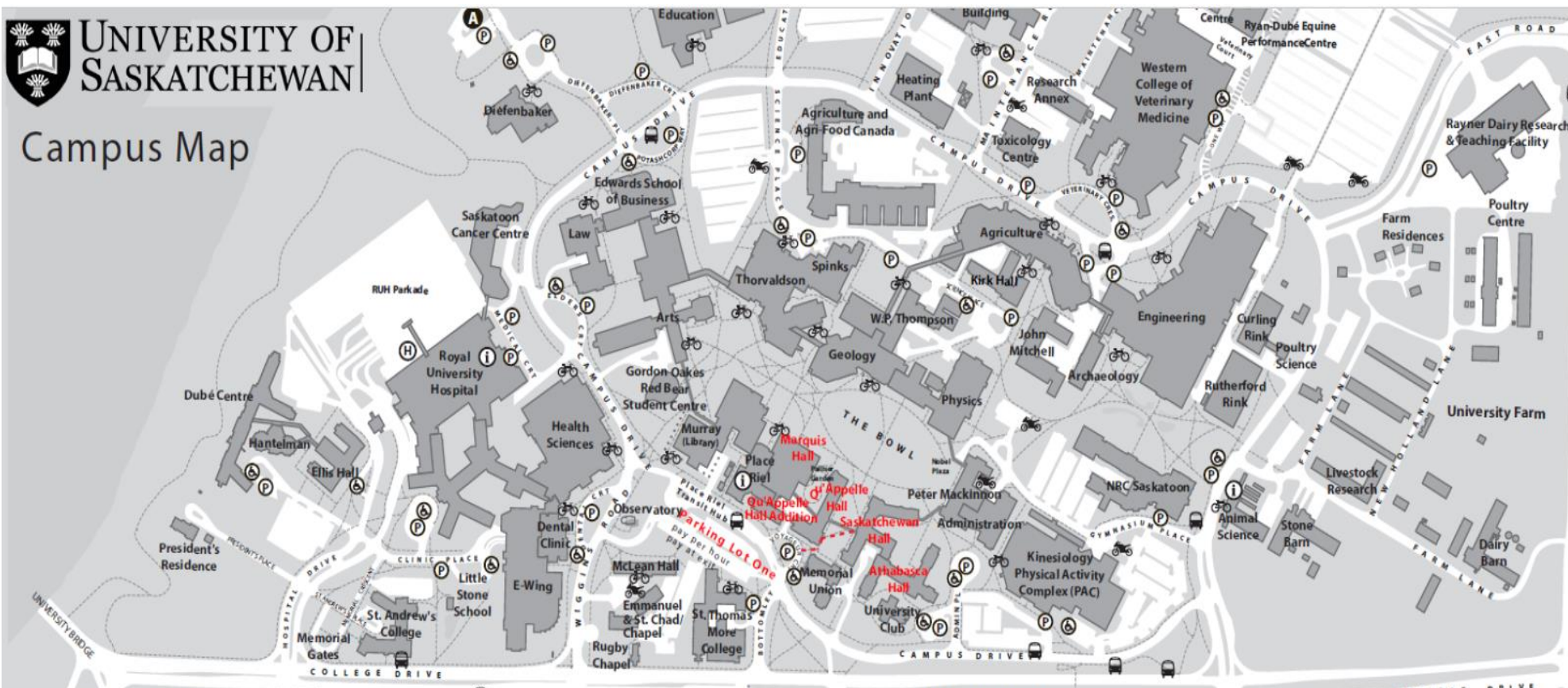









Campus Map

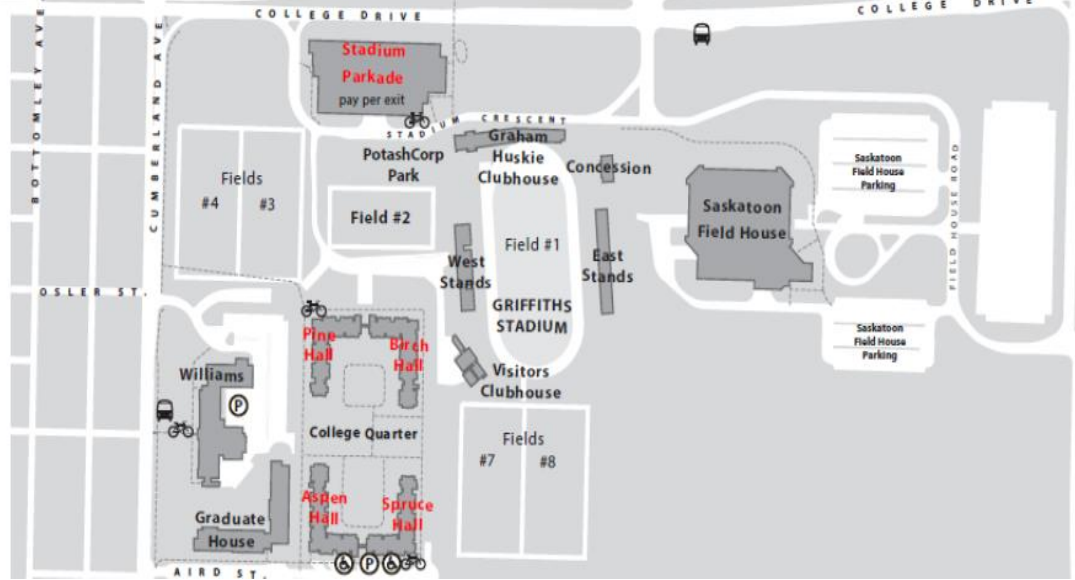

The Residence Services Office is located at 128 Saskatchewan Hall. We recommend that guests are dropped off at the loop in front of the Memorial Union Building, follow the diagonal path to the left, and then turn right at the small fork. The path leads directly to the main entrance of Saskatchewan Hall. Once inside, go into the hallway and turn right and then take the first left to reach our office for key pickup. If arriving after office hours, separate email instructions regarding key pickup will be sent.

For those staying in Saskatchewan Hall: go back to the main hallway and take a right. Continue past the offices until reaching the stairs located behind double doors. Rooms are located to the right and the left of the double doors on the first floor and similarly on the second. Room numbers increase numerically with 100s on the first floor and 200s on the second.

For those staying in Athabasca Hall: continue past the office and taking a right. Once down the first small set of stairs go left past the student lounges, until the end of the hallway where the elevator is. Once on the floors, there are directional signs on the walls (similar to how it is in some hotels).

For those staying in Qu'Appelle Hall: Return outside via the main entrance. Qu'Appelle Hall is across the courtyard from Saskatchewan Hall. Once inside, room numbers increase numerically with 100s on the first floor and 200s on the second.
